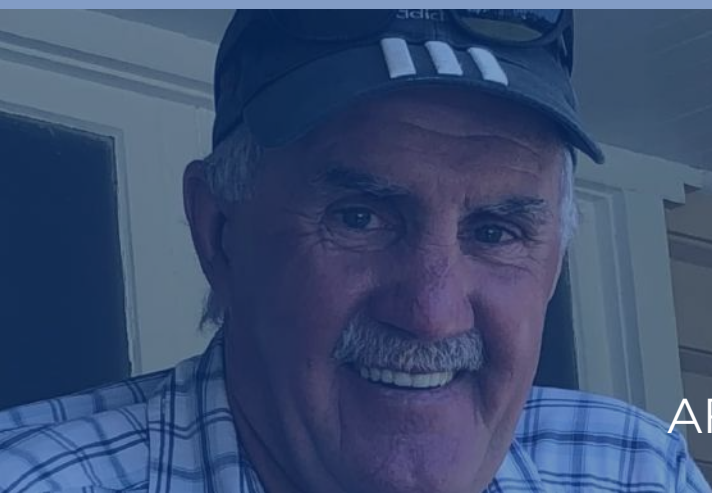

2019 GRAND FINALS

GOONDIWINDI VS COOLAROO

In a fitting finish to the season, the two top sides of the 2019 Allied Pickfords Cup will face off in this weekend's Senior Grand Final when minor premiers Goondiwindi take on Coolaroo.

Goondiwindi will be hoping it's third time lucky in 2019 after finishing with the runners up tag in 2017 and 2018, whilst Coolaroo will be looking to replicate the 2015 Grand Final where they were victorious over the Hawks.

Whilst the 3 matches between the sides in 2019 sees Goondiwindi hold a 2-1 record, Coolaroo's sole victory was at Rockville Park, which will no doubt play into the Roos favour when the two sides meet there this weekend.

The game might well be won from inside the coaches boxes this weekend, with arguably the regions two top coaches showing plenty of creativity in their approach across the season. Knowing when to 'pull the trigger' in a big game may prove crucial in deciding a Grand Final and the Grigg v Copland coaching battle will be one to watch.

Three Keys For Goondiwindi

Charles Youngman – Youngman has been arguably the competitions biggest recruit of the season, who's gone on to take out the Holman Medal, tying with Coolaroo's skipper Michael Langton. The crafty midfielder has a knack of drifting forward and kicking goals making him a threat right across the park.

Brenton Jardine - One of the competitions most experience players, Jardine's versatility seems him able to shut down key opposition targets across half back, or do damage to the scoreboard in the forward line. this versatility makes him a real 'ace up the sleeve' for Grigg.

Jeremy Leahy - Leahy for many years has been one of the competitions elite midfielders, bagging two Holman Medals in 2014/15. The hard running, no frills veteran is the backbone of the Hawks midfield and will be one who will give his all for an elusive Hawks flag.

Three Keys For Coolaroo

Sam Copland - The Coolaroo junior returned to DD football this year after stints in the NEAFL & QAFL and is one of the competitions elite. He has proven to be a strong goal kicking option for the Roos but is equally dangerous when thrown into the midfield.

Adam Green - One of the competitions all time leading goal scorers, Green has nearly 500 senior goals to his name and if he is to be given any freedom on Saturday will be a difficult player to stop hitting the scoreboard.

Michael Langton - Sharing the Holman Medal with Youngman, Langton is in career best form and can tear sides apart with his hard run out of the midfield. Expect a real captains effort from the Roo's Skipper on Saturday.

TOOWOOMBA VS. UNIVERSITY

After 15 rounds and 3 weeks of finals, only one match is left in the AFL Darling Downs Women's season and on Saturday, arch rivals the Toowoomba Tigers and University Cougars go head to head for the coveted premiership cup.

The Cougars and Tigers dominated all season, leading the way in the AFLDDW but it hasn't come easy for both sides. USQ have been rocked by serious injuries in the latter half of the year and the women in yellow and black have seen 46-different players don the club guernsey. If we look back at the season that was the ledger sits at 3-3 on the head to head count, so it doesn't get any closer than this.

So, where is the game won?

The three keys for Tigers

Melony Baker – The soccer convert has been one of the yellow and blacks most consistent this season named in their best 11 of her 13 games. Her ability on both sides of her body is second to none on the competition and ability to read the play is first class. Superb on-baller but maybe a match winner off a half-back on the big stage.

Chloe Cocks – The young gun, rugby star is one of the competitions most exciting players. At just 16 years of age, Chloe is one of the AFLDDW contested ball winning magnets and on the big stage will be a barometer for the reigning premiers.

Meg Pullinger – The new tiger who has booted a mammoth 55 goals and is the Tigers number one avenue to goal. The competitions best forward and most versatile, don't expect Pullinger to stay inside forward fifty. Having her around the contest, with her leadership and ball winning ability will important if the Tigers are to lift a fifth straight cup.

The three keys for Cougars

Phoebe Baird – Currently under an injury cloud but if playing, the newly crowned Heather Green Medallist will be key. Her speed on the outside of the contest and long penetrating kicking are what have set up the Cougars in their three wins over the Tigers this season. If she plays, will be important.

Nyengela Mwajuma – One of the competitions elite clearance players and outside runners, with her precise foot skills and ability to break open a game with a wide release handball. If the Cougars are to win, Nyengela will play a big part in the outcome.

Kendyl Scott – Has gone under the radar of opposition teams this year but is the most consistent Cougar after named in their best 10 out of a possible 13 games. Scott has proven she as a player who can impact the scoreboard and provides a lot of two-way running for USQ.

MATCH PREVIEW

2019 GRAND FINALS UNIVERSITY VS. COOLAROO

The two Under 14 powerhouses of recent years will again meet in the biggest game of the year to decide who'll be crowned the 2019 premiers.

These two sides have battled out the Under 14 Grand Final over the past two seasons with the ledger 1 a piece, with University premiers in 2017 and Coolaroo running out premiers in 2018. The 2019 scorecard sees University hold a 2-0 lead, however Coolaroo are finishing the season off with a wet sail, not dropping a match since Round 8 and putting on two very strong performances in weeks 1 and 2 of finals.

Both the Coolaroo and University squads boast a huge amount of talent, with 14 Darling Downs Demons reps coming out these two sides which will make for one cracking game of footy.

Three Keys for Cougars

Clifford Mitchell - One of the competitions craftiest forwards, Mitchell has kicked 29 majors this season and is University's leading goal kicker in 2019. His ability to kick goals from anywhere in the forward line is an area Coolaroo will need to shut down.

Levi Parker - The bold defender is among the best in the competition, with his hard running style out of the back line his key feature. His speed matched with his game awareness sees him constantly turn defence into attack for the Cougars.

James Potter - Whilst missing almost half the season through injury, Potter finished 3rd in the Best & Fairest count for the Under 14 competition, making a huge mark in his 8 home and away matches. He is a young ball magnet with exceptional skills making him one of Uni's, and the competitions most dangerous players and will be a key player if Uni are to be crowned premiers in 2019.

Three Keys for Coolaroo

Corey Lenton - Lenton is the leading ruckman of the Under 14 division, and his ruck battle with Uni's Majak will be a true test of both young leaders. Lenton's ability to win the ruck and give his on-ballers first use will be crucial to Coolaroo's ability to put Uni on the back foot.

Caleb Misfud - One of the competitions leading goal kickers, Misfud is a very dangerous forward and could win the match off his own boot on Saturday. His crafty ability to hit the scoreboard and fellow Roos forwards means he is one that University's defenders will need to keep an eye on.

Luke Silver - Silver is a hardworking backman with plenty of run off the half back flank. His superior endurance sees him run all game and is an intelligent footballer who will give the Coolaroo side plenty on Saturday.

SOUTH TOOWOOMBA VS. UNIVERSITY

After 45 regular season matches, the distribution of 270 Peltz Medal votes and 458 goals kicked and 3 finals matches, we are down to the final two teams.

South Toowoomba Bombers and the University Cougars are left to fight it out for the AFL Darling Downs Under 12 premiership on Saturday morning. Entering this season, University Cougars were the overwhelming favourites and considerably so after winning five straight premierships in the Under 12 competition from 2014-2018. The much improved Bombers at the start of the season, weren't even in premiership discussions and after their impressive qualifying final win will start favourites and rightly so.

What it means for the Bombers: 2010 was the last time the Bombers claimed a youth premiership on the Darling Downs and with only one team playing on Grand Final day, the entire red and black of South Toowoomba are right behind the young Bombers.

What it means for the Cougars: USQ have won five straight premierships in the Under 12 competition, dating back to 2014 and if the Cougars can win this it will be the clubs 25th youth premiership – cementing their place as the most successful youth club in the region.

The key three for Bombers

Noah Brownlie – In his first season of footy, the rookie midfielder Brownlie has dominated the competition with his daring runs and raking left boot

Hugo Le Lievre – An unlikely key goal kicker, but this crafty small forward knows where to be as the footy comes inside 50 and has an uncanny ability of knowing where the goals are.

Jordi Groom – The hard running midfielder has had a standout year for the Bombers, playing mainly in the midfield and is a key midfielder when it comes to the Bombers clearances and hitting the scoreboard.

The key three for Cougars

Tarkyn Benton – Quick, smart, agile and first class ability to read the play. After returning from the school boys State Championships in June has taken his football to another level.

Bol Makauch – His never give up attitude is what sets him a-part and loves the big stage. Great two way runner, who will be a key for the Cougars.

Aaron Convery – Does everything the coach asks of him, one of the Cougars most consistent his year with outstanding spatial awareness, things just seem to slow down around Convery.
