MATCH PREVIEW

PALM BEACH CURRUMBIN V WILSTON GRANGE

The QAFL Colts Grand Final today between Palm Beach Currumbin and Wilston Grange looks to be a fairly even battle, with both teams winning all but three games this season, meaning the 2019 Premiership Cup is anyone's for the taking.

Round 10 was the first time the two teams went head to head this season, and it was Palm Beach Currumbin who took the honours, defeating the Gorillas in a slim 8-point affair.

The tide shifted at their next encounter in Round 17, where the Gorillas dominated the Lions in a 9.12 (66) to 3.2 (20) victory, securing their spot in the first week of finals.

Last year the Lions had the most successful finals campaign, ruining the Gorillas' shot at victory in the Preliminary Finals to book their ticket to the big dance.

This is where their fairy tale run ended, going down by 22-points to the Western Magpies in an upset.

This year both teams are out for redemption; but who wants it the most?

For the Brisbane based team, leading goal kicker Noah McFayden will be hard for the Lions to tame with his ability to convert scores onto the board for his side.

Gracen Sproule has been in the Gorilla's best 12 times and half-forward Reed Maskell-Dobbyn continues his consistently good service to his team, and they will be ones to watch.

The Lions advantage? They boast the competition's leading goal kicker, so it will be up to the Gorillas to shut Riley Engels down before he adds to his tally, now sitting on an average of 3.56 goals per game.

Lions halfback Jack Granville has appeared the most in his team's best players this season, and forward Sam Carter is an all-round gun for the Gold Coast based club.

Lions youngster Aidan McCabe was instrumental in their finals campaign last year and has continued his strong form this season, while Gorilla's Daniel Luers has been the key to his side.

With both teams vying for that top position, it should be a great battle of footy here at Metricon Stadium.

GROGAN MEDAL

MT GRAVATT VETERAN FRAZER NEATE SOLIDIFIED HIS CULT HERO STATUS ON SUNDAY NIGHT WHEN HE WAS CROWNED THE 74TH MEMBER OF THE J.A. GROGAN MEDAL FRATERNITY IN A THRILLING VOTE COUNT AT THE GABBA.

The count truly went down to the wire with three votes in the Vulture's Round 19 win over Labrador enough to edge Neate past teammate Andrew Smith and Palm Beach Currumbin midfielder Thomas Thynne.

In all, he polled 18 votes across the season to join an illustrious fraternity of previous seasons despite missing two games with broken ribs.

"It's the best thing to ever happen to me. I'm really happy," Neate said following his crowning moment.

Neate, one of the competition's best contested midfielders, has called Dittmer Park home since the age of five where he has chalked up over 100 senior games for the Vultures.

His Grogan Medal triumph as the best and fairest player in the QAFL comes despite Neate having not won a Mt Gravatt best and fairest award.

Neate finished runner up in both 2018 and 2019 and has never sat atop the club's own standings but now finds himself immortalised among 73 other names etched into QAFL history.

SURFERS PARADISE V PALM BEACH CURRUMBIN

It's fitting that the same two sides battling it out for premiership success in the senior QAFL Grand Final will also be contesting the Reserves game three hours prior.

It's a nod to the deep playing lists at both Surfers Paradise and Palm Beach Currumbin – the two best teams across both competitions throughout season 2019.

The game itself is shaping up to be a nail biter and you only need to look back to their Qualifying Final matchup a fortnight ago to see why.

The two teams met on Salk Oval and nothing could separate the two teams after four thrilling quarters. The game – and an early spot in the Grand Final – went into overtime where the Demons prevailed by just a solitary point.

Even then, not much separated them with Demon Zane Baker's late goal and a behind that hit the post the only difference.

Looking back over the season, nearly every contest between the Demons and Lions was a thriller and this weekend's premiership decider will be the latest chapter in a competitive series.

The Demons earned the four points in their final regular season game in Round 18, winning by 12-points in a low scoring affair.

Livewire forward Cody Filewood shone that day in the navy and red, booting three goals, while 2018 QAFL Rising Star nominee, Jasper Graham, was superb through the middle.

Earlier in the season, it was the Lions who earned a comfortable 39-point win thanks to four goals from Jarryd Douglas and a commendable performance from Brock Askey.

In the contest, look for the Minor Premier Surfers Paradise outfit to leverage on Zane Baker, Elliott Bath and team leading goal kicker, Hayden Correa, to lead the way.

Meanwhile, keys for Palm Beach Currumbin is co-captain Nathan Carr, who finished third in the Bill Clerke Medal for the QAFL Reserve's Best and Fairest player, having booted a competition-high 46-goals this season.

Carr's other co-captain, Matt Fife, who earned 12 votes to finished fifth overall in the voting, will also be a key for the Lions.

If there is one area where Palm Beach Currumbin have a clear advantage over Saturday's grand final rivals Surfers Paradise it's experience on the September big stage.

When it comes to that valued commodity of having been there, done that, the Lions have it in truckloads.

Jesse Derrick, Jackson Emblem, Stephen and Tom Thynne, Tyler Comish have all played in multiple grand finals together and won a lot of them.

It is that familiarity on big occasions that should stand the Lions in good stead this weekend.

Surfers have very few, if any, players who have sampled grand finals atmosphere.

There are those people who say a team needs to lose a grand final before they win one and they point out the fact that the last two QAFL premiers lost grand finals before they won one.

This was the case when Labrador lost to Morningside in 2014 before winning the next two grand finals. In 2016 they beat Palm Beach Currumbin who then went on to win flags in 2017 and 2018.

But for the Demons, the last time the club played in a grand final was back in 2004.

Now the threepeat is on for the Lions against Surfers at Metricon Stadium today.

And, on results this year following an interrupted pre-season – when coach Chad Owens elected to chase greener pastures in Victoria – the PBC form guide has been an outstanding one.

The post-Christmas appointment of former Fremantle and North Melbourne AFL player, Jess Sinclair, has proven to be problem-free.

Sinclair inherited a close-knit group that lost only twice in 2018 and just the once this year, ironically to Surfers Paradise in round 18.

What Sinclair quickly learned was that he had a team loaded with talent across all areas.

Like Surfers have through bulky full-forward Dan Green, the Lions have a match-winner in Jack Anthony, who was named Joe Grant Medallist in the 2018 Grand Final with his five goals against Broadbeach.

After an injury-riddled finish to his season Anthony is primed for another big one when it matters most, but will face a crucial matchup with Demons skipper Brody Haberfield in the contest.

The former Collingwood and Fremantle AFL player kicked 41 goals in his first seven matches before sustaining a bad ankle injury.

He is a clear and present danger for the Demons on Saturday – but the same thing can be said about Dan Green. When he fires, he can be unstoppable and he makes team mates stand that much taller with his physical presence in the goal square.

Around the ground the Lions have quality ball users, in particular Tom and Stephen Thynne, Jason Burge, the Harrison brothers Jed and Zac, flanker Dylan Troutman – the list goes on and on.

Worth noting is the vote count at last weekend's J. A. Grogan Medal presentation.

PBC had four players – Tom Thynne (17 votes), 2016 winner Jesse Derrick (14), Jack Anthony (11) and 2017 co-winner Jason Burge (9) in the top 10.

An unbreakable team ethic has carried the Surfers Paradise Demons to the cusp of ending a 20-year premiership drought against Palm Beach Currumbin at Metricon Stadium on Saturday.

For so long a club thirsting for success but deprived of a drink from a premiership cup for two decades, this year's version of Surfers Paradise – along the lines of all for one and one for all – has emerged under the coaching of Brad Moore.

This weekend's season finale will herald the retirement of champion full-forward Dan Green, who first donned the red and blue as a four-year-old tacker.

Green has announced his retirement and it would be a wonderful fairy tale ending to his career if he can finally crack it for a premiership.

But giving Green some personal success is only part of the Surfers quest.

Sure, he will be a focal point, but this grand final will be all about the word 'team', doing it together and for each other.

Although the Demons played finals under Peter Young and Beau Zorko, when Moore joined the club they had just four wins in 2017.

They rose to finish fourth last year and after this season's preliminary rounds were completed the Demons were second.

What has been noticeable for the only team to have

beaten premiers Palm Beach Currumbin in 2019 has been the emergence of a number of young talents.

The development in a number of them has been exceptional.

If you look at where the likes of Jack Taylor, Daniel Van de Werken, Sam and Myles Jewell, Josh Matulis, Thompson Smith, Alby Jones, Rene LeFeuvre, Alby Jones, Thompson Smith and Jack Prestegar were a couple of years ago, it is patently clear that Moore has managed to bring out the best in his troops – both as individuals and as close-knit team members.

"The thing is that I could see it was progressing but sometimes you have to be patient and it takes some time to get to the end," said Demons coach Brad Moore.

"You have to have a starting point but once the team can build success the players get more individual recognition as well.

"When the team's not getting wins on the board it's a bit harder for opposition teams to know who are the ones to watch out for, apart from the main couple like the Greens have always been.

"Individually they have progressed together on the back of what we've been doing as a collective."

Moore said it is all about getting the most out of every player, from the big guns like Green and Brody Haberfield, down to number 22 on the list.

"Palm Beach have set the benchmark with that," said Moore.

"They developed a strong bond a few years ago and that got them to that first grand final – and they went on from there."
