

Purpose



More people playing AFL, having more enjoyment while playing, playing longer



More involvement = more fun = more participation

National Participation Framework





Recommended guidelines based off research/data/studies



Field Size, number of players on the field, ball size etc.



Skill development, enjoyment and experiences



Literature Review - Background



- 1. Junior Match Policy (2013)
- 2. Deakin University engaged to study:
 - > Impact of its presence/absence
 - Actual impact on enjoyment and skill development
- 3. Research conducted by AFL Working Group:
 - Understand the experience of children in junior modified sport
 - > 84-page document available
- 4. Recommendations provided
- 5. Further research and updated recommendations

Literature Review – Key Findings



1. Modified rules achieve two clear outcomes:

- > Increases player involvement, perception of competence and enjoyment
- Better match environment

2. Important to parents = important to kids

- > #1 kids play sport to have fun
- 3. Study of 81 characteristics of fun:
 - > Top 3 trying hard, positive team dynamics, positive coaching
 - Winning = #48

4. Difference between competing and winning

- 'Compete at all times, not win at all costs'
- 5. Leagues that implemented the modified rules:
 - Highest attraction of new participants (10% higher)
 - > 5 times more likely to play at the elite level (male & female)

Literature Review - Modified Rules



1. Less players on field:

- > Increases player involvement
- > Involvement = enjoyment & perception of competence = participation
- Lessens a barrier to entry

2. Smaller field:

- > Increases in number of touches and skill development
- Increase in decision making/problem solving opportunities
- > Decreased reliance on endurance and instead focus on skill development
- Increased concentration and engagement

3. Shorter quarters:

- Better skill execution (less fatigue)
- Less 'blow outs' = higher engagement

SEQJ Match Statistics - Disposals

Key Points

- 1. One third of players had 0-5 disposals
- 2. Two thirds of players had 10 or less disposals
- 3.% of players with 5 or less disposals increases as the number of players on the field increases *
- 4.76% of disposals are contested

SEQJ Match Statistics - Scorecards



- 1. 95% of teams winning at ¾ time went on to win
 - Biggest margin to comeback from was just 14 points
- 2. 73% saw the team leading at ¾ time increase their margin
 - By an average of 9 points
- 3. Of teams leading by 5+ goals at ¾ time:
 - > 87% increased their lead
 - > By an average of 14.1 points
 - > 47% of matches had a 5+ goal lead at ¾ time
- 4. Of teams leading by 10+ goals at ¾ time:
 - > 96% increased their lead
 - > By an average of 20.6 points
 - > 15% of matches had a 10+ goal lead at ¾ time

Club Feedback - Proposed Changes



1. U11 Mixed & Girls:

- Maximum 12 players on field
- > 4 x 13-minute quarters

2. U13 Mixed:

- Maximum 14 players on field (up to 18 on team sheet)
- Maximum field size reduced to 150 x 110
- Div 1 remains 18 a side full field

3. U13 Girls:

Maximum field size increased to 140 x 110



Club Feedback – Summary



- 1. 45 Clubs provided feedback
- 2. Some of the challenges raised:
 - > Extra teams require volunteers/greenspace/umpires
 - Logistical challenges with fixturing
 - Communication with parents (reasons behind changes)
- 3. Main takeaways for 2024:
 - More time, communication and data required before major changes are implemented
 - Implement some smaller tweaks initially instead
 - Coaching education & investment required



Outcomes for 2024



U13 Mixed

- 1. Remain 18 a side but maximum 20 on team sheet (2 on bench)
 - Minimal disruptions
 - Average game time increases from 82% to 90%.
 - > Expected reduction in issues with finals eligibility
- 2. Retain maximum field length but reduce minimum to 120 x 90
- 3. Reduce minimum numbers to 12 (was 14)

U13 Girls

- 1. Field range of 100 140m x 80 110m
- 2. Reduce team sheet (bench) size from 16 to 14
 - > Average game time increase from 75% to 86%
- 3. 'Last possession rule' to be discussed with Clubs

Outcomes for 2024



Under 11s

- 1. Keep U11 Mixed at 15 a side until clear on U13 Mixed
- 2. Adjust U11 Mixed quarter lengths to 13 minutes
 - Opportunity to obtain comparative data
- 3. Keep U11 Girls at 10-minute quarters
 - Friday night comps allows timeslot alignment with U9 Girl games
 - > Can play 2 games at same time

U15/U17 Girls

- 1. Reduce team sheet (bench) sizes in U15/17 Girls from 22 to 19
 - > Average game time increase from 73% to 84%
